Louisiana Statistics*

(From Children's Defense Fund, Nov. 2008)

A child is born into poverty every 30 minutes.

A child is abused or neglected every 42 minutes.

A child dies before his or her first birthday every 14 hours.

A child or teen is killed by gunfire every 4 days.

Number of children in poverty (and percent in poverty) 283,350 (26.8%)

Number of children living in extreme poverty (and percent in extreme poverty) 124,373 (11.7%)

- Federal Poverty Guidelines are calculated annually by Dept. of Health and Human Services (HHS)
- 2008 Poverty Guideline for a family of 4: \$21,200 annual income
- 2008 Extreme Poverty Guideline for a family of 4: \$10,600 (50% of Poverty Guideline)
